





























The mission of a **Crisis Response Shepherd** is to ensure that every family impacted by crisis encounters God and finds physical, emotional, and spiritual restoration through the love and support of a trained Shepherd from Ark of Highland Lakes.

Shepherd Qualifications

- Be a Lover of God.
- Be an Ambassador of Christ, the Church, and Ark of Highland Lakes
- Be an Advocate for your new friend
- Bring the Presence of God into their lives
 Love. Joy. Peace. Patience. Kindness. Goodness.
 - Faithfulness. Gentleness. Self-Control.
- Be Dependent on God
 - Walk in humility. Intercede and steward His promises.
 - Be a conduit connecting them to the Body of Christ

The Job...

- Meet them where they are.
- Ask open-ended questions to help them process their situation
- Help them with important decisions that may be difficult due to the traumatic event(s)/situation
- Trust the Holy Spirit's leading this is the key to ministry!
- Check in at least weekly; be constant in prayer; one-on-one relationship; commitment to see the case through to restoration.
- Facilitate the objectives inside the client's recovery plan.

Vision for a Shepherd

- "Love God. Love People." Unconditionally.
- The Good Samaritan (*Luke 10:25-37*)
 - "...go and do likewise..."
- Team approach You are not alone.
- Discipleship The client will see/experience Jesus through their encounter with us and desire to draw closer to Christ and other Christ followers


Every family in crisis will encounter God and be materially, emotionally, and spiritually impacted through the support of a prepared shepherd from a local church.



Key Phrases to Share As Needed

- Empathy I am so sad that you and your family are going through this right now. I assure you that you are not alone. We will get through this together.
- Affirmation Remember, you are a normal person having a normal reaction to an abnormal situation
- Support What could I do right now that would help you the most?
- Reframe expectations I may not be able to do that, but here is what I can do

Shepherding IS Discipling

Discipleship - the reforming of a person's heart, mind and character to be more like Jesus – begins to take place as they hang around with people who are already loving them like Jesus would and modeling the life of a disciple of Jesus in all their interactions with them. Ultimately, it is the consistent experience of people loving them like Jesus does that eventually brings them to the point of conversion, and by that time, they are well on their way to beginning resemble Jesus, too.

"WRAP" Around Service

- W: Walk beside them for the duration. Your attitude matters.
 Lead gently, guide patiently, communicate well.
- R: Relationship. Develop a partnership God will work through it. Carry them close to your heart. Develop a communication style that proclaims the goodness of God in every interaction.
- A: Advocate: Build them up with your words, be authentic, communicate back to Ark and help empower them to meet their goals.
- P: Pray. Offer prayer. Ask: "How can I pray for you?" Pray for the family on your own, but also pray with them at every encounter.

Meeting Needs

Gather them to yourself and carry them close to your heart (Isa. 40:11)

Emotional

- Be present. When we are intentional, regular, consistent: Communication is deliberate; connection is deepened;
 Christ-likeness is developed; Fruit is produced.
- Listen Well and HEAR their heart. Mourn with those who mourn.
- Prayer and Compassion.

Spiritual

- Invite God into the center of their need. Lead gently with patience and affirmation.
- Demonstrate the love Christ Jesus: Build a relationship.
- Share the HOPE found in knowing Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

Physical

- Assess needs. Sheep are most productive when properly cared for (affection) and cared for (food/shelter/ safety).
- Help to think through possible solutions
- Communicate needs to Ark Case Management
- Assist with recovery tasks

This requires an investment of time, talent, and effort into the lives of others.

Proclaim the Goodness of God at all times


DON'T Preach

What NOT To Do

- Do Not: Try to change or fix people
- Do Not: Monopolize the conversation... it's not about you.
- Do Not: Focus on your agenda over the relationship
- Do Not: Push religion on them invite them into a relationship
- Do Not: Judge or compare them to yourself
- Do Not imply:
 - You know what is best
 - They are less capable than you
 - You can figure things out better than they can
 - You are a counselor.

Boundaries: Know the Limits

- Proverbs 4:33 above all else, guard your heart...
- Acknowledge that you don't have all the answers
- Know when to rest
- Be kind to yourself and forgiving of your mistakes
- Know when you have done all you can
- Know when the situation is out of control
- Know that you cannot do everything and that you should not even try to do some things
- Know that you do not have to carry the load (financial, emotional, spiritual, etc) on your own.
